Douro shawl

YARN

5 skeins of **Douro** from Rosários 4, in colour 09 (100% organic yarn, 50 g/280 m).

6 balls of **Aurora** from Rosários 4, in colour 27 (70% mohair kid, 30% silk, 25 g/210 m).

The shawl is knitted with both yarns held together.

GAUGE

16 sts and 26 rows – 10 x 10 cm in garter stitch with 4,5 mm needle, washed and blocked (it's important to wash and block your swatch in order to get the correct gauge).

NEEDLES

4,5 mm circular needles (if necessary, adjust the needle size to match the gauge).

NOTIONS

Stitch markers, tapestry needle.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

217 cm long and 72 cm wide in the center.

INSTRUCTIONS

PORTUGUESE KNITTING STYLE (garter stitch worked by purling all rows)

Garter tab cast on:

With waste yarn cast on 2 sts. Change to working yarn (both yarns held together) and purl 48 rows.

Row 1: P2, **yo**, turn the work 90 degrees and pick up and purl 24 sts along the selvedge, **yo**, unravel the waste yarn cast-on and purl the 2 sts – total of 30 sts on the needle.

Row 2 (WS): P2, P1 tbl, P to 3 sts from end, P1 tbl, P2.

Work increases:

Row 3 (RS): P2, **Pfb x 2**, P to 4 sts from end, **Pfb x 2**, P2.

Row 4 (WS): P2, **Pfb**, P to 3 sts from end, **Pfb**, P2.

Row 5 (RS): P2, **Pfb**, P2, **Pfb**, pm, P24, pm, **Pfb**, P2, **Pfb**, P2.

Row 6 (WS): P2, **Pfb**, P to 3 sts from end, **Pfb**, P2. [42 sts]

Work the lace center panel:

Row 1 (RS): P2, **Pfb**, P to 1 st before marker, **Pfb**, slm, **[chart A]**, slm, **Pfb**, P to 3 sts from end, **Pfb**, P2.

Row 2 (WS): P2, **Pfb**, P to marker, slm, **[chart A]**, slm, P to 3 sts from end, **Pfb**, P2.

Work in established pattern until you complete 6 repeats of the 20 rows from chart A. [402 sts]

Work plain rows:

Row 1 (RS): P2, **Pfb**, P to 1 st before marker, **Pfb**, slm, P to marker, slm, **Pfb**, P to 3 sts from end, **Pfb**, P2.

Row 2 (WS): P2, **Pfb**, P to marker, slm, P to marker, slm, P to 3 sts from end, **Pfb**, P2.

Repeat rows 1 and 2, 2 more times. Don't cut the yarn. [420 sts]

CONTINENTAL OR ENGLISH STYLE (garter stitch worked by knitting all rows)

Garter tab cast-on:

With waste yarn cast on 2 sts. Change to working yarn (both yarns held together) and knit 48 rows.

Row 1: K2, yo, turn the work 90 degrees and pick up and purl 24 sts along the selvedge, yo, unravel the waste yarn and knit the 2 sts – total of 30 sts on the needle.

Row 2 (WS): K2, K1 tbl, K to 3 sts from end, K1 tbl, K2.

Work increases:

Row 3 (RS): K2, **Kfb x 2**, K to 4 sts from end, **Kfb x 2**, K2.

Row 4 (WS): K2, **Kfb**, K to 3 sts from end, **Kfb**, K2.

Row 5 (RS): K2, **Kfb**, K2, **Kfb**, pm, K24, pm, **Kfb**, K2, **Kfb**, K2.

Row 6 (WS): K2, **Kfb**, K to 3 sts from end, **Kfb**, K2. [42 sts]

Work the lace center panel:

Row 1 (RS): K2, **Kfb**, K to 1 st before marker, **Kfb**, slm, **[chart A]**, slm, **Kfb**, K to 3 sts from end, **Kfb**, K2.

Row 2 (WS): K2, **Kfb**, K to marker, slm, **[chart A]**, slm, K to 3 sts from end, Kfb, K2.

Work in established pattern until you complete 6 repeats of the 20 rows from chart A. [402 sts]

Work plain rows:

Row 1 (RS): K2, **Kfb**, K to 1 st before marker, **Kfb**, slm, K to marker, slm, **Kfb**, K to 3 sts from end, **Kfb**, K2.

Row 2 (WS): K2, **Kfb**, K to marker, K to marker, slm, K to 3 sts from end, **Kfb**, K2.

Repeat rows 1 and 2, 2 more times. Don't cut the yarn. [420 sts]

ALL TECHNIQUES

Lace edging

With WS facing and using a backwards loop method, cast on 18 sts. Turn and work the lace edging following **chart B**. The edging will be joined to the body of the shawl at the end of every odd numbered row by working a "P2tog tbl" over the last st of the edging and the next live st of the shawl. Repeat the 28 rows of chart B 30 times. That is, until all sts of the body of the shawl have been worked. Bind off edging sts.

FINISHING

Weave in all sts with tapestry needle. Wet block to finished measurements.





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YEARS

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ABBREVIATIONS

K: knit

P: purl

RS: right side

WS: wrong side

cm: centimeters

st/sts: stitch/stitches

pm: place marker

slm: slip marker

Kfb: knit front and back (*knit 1 stitch but don't drop it of left-hand needle; knit the same stitch again through back loop and drop it off the needle*)

Pfb: purl front and back (*purl 1 stitch but don't drop it of left-hand needle; purl the same stitch again through back loop and drop it off the needle*) yo – yarn over

K2tog: knit 2 stitches together

K2tog tbl: knit 2 stitches together through back loop

P2tog: purl 2 stitches together

P2tog tbl: purl 2 stitches together through back loop

sl1wyif: slip 1 st purlwise and with yarn in front
